Job Duties:

Drives ambulance in all weather and traffic conditions in a safe manner and as quickly as possible; provides emergency medical treatment in the field and in transit to medical facilities within certification level; disentangles and extricates individuals at the scene of an accident using common and specialized hand and power tools; fills out and completes ambulance records.

Conducts daily and weekly vehicle and equipment maintenance repairs or reports needed repairs to an officer; completes and routes forms and reports.

Drives apparatus to scene of fire; controls and extinguishes fire and hazardous chemicals using water, chemicals, dry powders and gases; protects life and property by controlling hazardous situations, evacuating people, and moving property or protecting with covers; selects hose and nozzle to use and directs to extinguish fires; positions and climbs ladders to gain access to upper levels of buildings or to assist people to exit structures; creates openings in buildings for ventilation or entrance using hand or power tools; fills out and processes fire reports.

Inspects businesses, single and multi-family residences, for compliance with city ordinances and fire codes; participates in investigation of fires to determine probable cause.

Prepares for, conducts, or participates in training sessions; maintains fire station equipment and grounds including routine housekeeping and maintenance duties such as painting, mopping, cleaning, and general repairs.

Makes presentations to the public on an assigned subject.

Attends work on a regular and dependable basis.

Interacts in a professional and respectful manner with city staff and the public.

Performs other tasks as assigned.

The **FIREFIGHTER PHYSICAL PERFORMANCE TEST** will be **SATURDAY, June 27, 2026 at 8 a.m. at the Clarkston Fire Department, 820 5th Street.** The physical test will be scored on a pass/fail basis. A copy of the physical test may be picked up at the Clarkston Fire Department or mailed, if requesting an application by mail.

The **ORAL BOARD** will be held on **SATURDAY, JUNE 27, 2026.** The time will be discussed with the applicants passing the physical performance test immediately following that test. A passing score of 70% is required.

Clarkston Fire Department volunteers and/or reserve firefighters in good standing will receive 10 points added to their total score as preference points.

GENERAL PURPOSE:

Under the direct supervision of captains and/or the Fire Chief, perform duties in response to: fire, hazardous materials, water rescue, extrication and rescue in a support role only; emergency medical scenes providing basic life support, intermediate life support, and/or advanced life support; and, maintaining fire department equipment, apparatus and buildings.

SUPERVISION RECEIVED:

Works under the general supervision of captains and/or Fire Chief.

SUPERVISION EXERCISED:

None.

ESSENTIAL JOB FUNCTIONS: *Essential functions, as defined under the Americans with Disabilities Act, may include any of the following representative duties, knowledge and skills. This list is ILLUSTRATIVE ONLY and is not a comprehensive listing of all functions and duties performed by incumbents of this class. Employees are required to be in attendance and prepared to begin work at their assigned work location on the specified days and hours. Factors such as regular attendance at the job are not routinely listed in job descriptions but are an essential function. Essential duties and responsibilities may include, but are not limited to, the following:*

- Perform fire suppression, hazmat, rescue and extrication, and water/ice rescue operations as assigned or required. Extinguish fires, including structural, automotive, wildland, chemical and petroleum applying appropriate techniques and extinguishing agents. Provide emergency medical services with certification at Paramedic level.
- Respond with and operate or support operators of fire apparatus, including:
 - fire engines
 - emergency vehicles
 - utility truck with wildland capacity
 - rescue boats
- Place and operate equipment including pumping, hydraulic power tools and devices, calculating water pressures, operation of electrical generators, and working from ground ladders or on rooftops.
- Perform emergency medical skills; initiate emergency care, including assessment, triage, treatment and transport. Perform skills within the level of EMS certification, including, but not limited to:
 - IV
 - Defibrillation
 - Airway support
 - Endotracheal intubation
 - Suctioning
 - CPR
 - Administration of medication

- Control bleeding
 - Bandaging
 - Splinting and stabilization
 - Receiving and assisting in transporting patients
 - Lift assists including very large patients
- Respond with and operate emergency vehicles as assigned or required.
- Place and operate patient care equipment, including, but not limited to:
 - Blood glucose monitor
 - Pulse oximeter
 - Stretchers
 - Stair chairs
 - Crash stretchers
 - Splints
 - Airway support
 - AED/cardiac monitor defibrillators
 - Operate extrication and rescue equipment
 - Lift and move patients of all sizes
- Work in all kinds of weather, in daylight and in darkness. Work on level, uneven or steep terrain.
- Drive or ride in ambulances. Provide services for patients by working in the back of ambulances on local or long-distance transports.
- Return vehicles and equipment to service after an incident. Clean and inspect fire department apparatus, tools and equipment. Refill fuel in saws, fans, generators and slip in wildland pump. Clean and reload hose, cardiac monitors, oxygen systems, and suction pumps. Refill SCBA bottles and oxygen bottles after an incident.
- Perform fire ground tasks. Properly wear personal protective equipment, including SCBA, drag hose, climb ladders, work on roofs, operate power tools, utilize hand tools and complete additional assigned tasks in all weather conditions in daylight and in the dark.
- Perform emergency medical services, including:
 - Lift patients
 - Operate gurneys, backboards, scoop stretchers, stair chairs, monitors, extrication tools and patient care equipment.
 - Operate vehicles in all weather conditions in daylight and in the dark.
- Maintain, clean and inspect fire department apparatus, tools and equipment. Check tires, batteries, fuel, oil and water levels, pumps, lights, horn and siren, cardiac monitors, oxygen systems, vacuum pumps, and all other related medical equipment, maintaining all appropriate service logs.
- Assume command and coordination of emergency fire and medical incidents until received by a ranking department member, providing leadership and control at emergency incidents.
- Complete and maintain a variety of records and reports related to fire suppression, medical emergencies, hose testing, hydrant testing, ladder testing, medical treatment and testing, as directed.
- Participate in the development and completion of goals and objectives.
- Participate in training drills and attend classes in various technical fire-related activities, techniques and procedures. Assist in the development and review of pre-fire plans. Read firefighting and EMS manuals and participate in in-house training.
- May be assigned to work out-of-classification as a Captain.
- Perform related duties as assigned.

OTHER JOB FUNCTIONS:

- Report shortage, malfunctions or defects in equipment, supplies and apparatus to supervisors or other personnel as appropriate.
- Restock medical supply cabinets in the station and at the hospital. Complete necessary documentation; Maintain records of supplies restocked in ambulances.
- Participate in inspections of businesses, applying the International Fire Code.
- Maintain fire station by sweeping, mopping and cleaning walkways, floors, windows and rooms. Paint and perform minor building maintenance and repairs, including changing lights, watering landscape features, pulling weeds and cutting grass.
- Assist with or conduct CPR, first aid, fire extinguisher and fire prevention classes for public groups, if qualified. Conduct safety and emergency awareness presentations. Conduct fire station tours and explain techniques, procedures, policies and safety precautions.
- Assist with or conduct pre-fire plans as directed.
- Maintain patient confidentiality.

- Operate fire apparatus including engines, rescue trucks, utility trucks, rescue boats and on-board equipment.
- Work proficiently at emergency scenes wearing Self-Contained Breathing Apparatus (SCBA).
- Maintain continuing education in suppression and EMS training.

Thorough knowledge of modern fire suppression and prevention, and of emergency medical services, principles, procedures, techniques and equipment. Thorough knowledge of fire code regulations. Working knowledge of first aid and resuscitation techniques and their application as demonstrated through State EMT certifications. Knowledge of applicable laws, ordinances, and department standard operating procedures and regulations. Considerable knowledge of applicable laws, ordinances, department standard operating procedures and regulations.

Skill in the operation of listed tools and equipment.

Possess the ability to:

- Train and supervise subordinate personnel.
- Communicate effectively both verbally and in writing.
- Exercise sound judgment in evaluating situations and in making decisions.

PHYSICAL DEMANDS:

The physical demands described here are representative of those that must be met by a incumbent to successfully perform the essential functions of this job. Reasonable accommodation may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform essential functions.

While performing the duties of this position, the incumbent is frequently required to sit, kneel, talk or hear, stand, walk, use hand and finger dexterity to handle or operate tools, objects or controls, and reach above the head or out from the torso with hands and arms. The incumbent is occasionally required to climb or balance, stoop, kneel, crouch or crawl, and taste and smell.

The incumbent must frequently lift and/or move up to 25 pounds, regularly lift and/or move up to 100 pounds, and occasionally move patients that require lifting of heavier weight. Specific vision abilities required by this job include close vision, distance vision, color vision, peripheral vision, depth perception, and the ability to adjust focus. Must hear to complete medical assessments.

WORK ENVIRONMENT:

The work environment characteristics described here are representative of those an employee encounters while performing the essential functions of this job.

Work is performed indoors and outdoors. This position is subject to 24-hour shifts, long durations without sleep, emergency call-outs, adverse weather conditions, and driving to conduct work.

Incumbent may be exposed to extreme heat and flames, toxic smoke, fumes and gases, chemicals and hazardous materials, flammable liquids, bodily fluids, people with altered mental states, people acting violently, high voltage, working at heights, and working with and around high-pressure hoses.

Physical activities include dexterity of hands and fingers to operate all types of medical apparatus; stretching, walking and standing for long periods of time; bending, heavy lifting, pulling, pushing, and carrying objects weighing 150 pounds or more; physical agility and stamina; reaching overhead, above the shoulders, and horizontally; seeing to operate vehicles and equipment; and, hearing to communicate with victims and firefighting personnel.

Work is performed from a fire station setting with a quiet environment . Work is frequently performed in vehicles and/or outdoor settings in all weather conditions, including temperature extremes. Work is often performed in private homes, extended care facilities or other health care facilities, and/or in roadways.

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POSITION DESCRIPTION**

Work is often performed in emergency and stressful situations. Incumbent may be exposed to rendering emergency medical assistance in adverse environments.

Incumbent may be exposed to hearing loud alarms. The noise level in the work environment will range from quiet in the station setting, to loud on an emergency scene.

Work is occasionally performed near moving parts and is occasionally performed in wet and/or humid conditions, fumes or airborne particles, toxic or caustic chemicals, risk of electric shock and vibration.

The duties listed above are intended only as illustrations of the various types of work that may be performed. The omission of specific statements of duties does not exclude them from the position if the work is similar, related or a logical assignment to the position.
